A Bride Goes West: by Nannie T. Alderson & Helena Huntington Smith. Nannie Tiffany moved to her new life on a cattle ranch in Montana in 1882. There is plenty about cattle ranching in this book, but what is most valuable is about life and the people in this ranch country. **\$12.95**

The Women's West: by Susan Armitage & Elizabeth Jameson. Readers will be able to gain an understanding of the role women have played in the settling and stabilization of the west due to the wide range of subjects relating to women in this book. **\$17.95**

All But the Waltz: by Mary Clearman Blew. A memoir of five generations in the life of a Montana family. **\$12.95**

The Gentle Tamers: by Dee Brown. A collection of stories about women who took part in the migrations westward in the period of 1850-1880. Stories included of Elizabeth Custer, Carry Nation, Virginia Reed. **\$11.95**

Cowgirls: by Teresa Jordan. Situates the cowgirl in history and literature with the compilation of more than 100 authentic stories of women running ranches and performing in rodeos. **\$14.00**

Cowgirls of the Rodeo: by Mary Lou LeCompte. A history of cowgirls in the rodeo. Defines these women as pioneer professional athletes. Describes the lives and careers of these women. Includes experiences growing up on ranches with photos of real life events. **\$16.95**

Heart of the Trail: by Mary Barmeyer O'Brien. The stories of eight wagon train women depicting their inspiration, courage, and resourcefulness. **\$ 9.95**
